- Companies specialising in the design of horticultural facilities, permanent plantations, and landscape projects
- Institutions managing protected areas where agriculture is practised (such as national, regional, and landscape parks), as well as botanical gardens
- Self-employment as agricultural entrepreneurs, producers, or consultants
- Sustainable agritourism
- Educational and research institutions

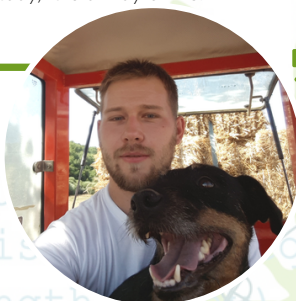
What do students think about studying at UP FAMNIT?
